PRESIDENT'S REPORT

The Essendon Water Polo Club is now in its thirties and has matured to a fine water polo citizen in the Victorian Community. The Club now has representation in most aspects of Water Polo Victoria in the pool with significant teams in the competition and elite players representing the State. The Club also supports the competition with referees and myself as a tribunal member and Board member.

In this year of competition we fielded two men's teams, three women's teams and three junior teams across Winter Competition, State Championships, and Sub-junior Competition.

The club also had multiple representatives in the Victorian Seals Women's National Water Polo League team. We enjoyed premierships for our Youth teams but the seniors struggled in finals after strong seasons.

The Essendon State League 4 Men ('A' Team) had a good year with the team making the grand final in both competitions. Unfortunately on both occasions the team was unable to deliver ultimate success.

The 2015 Winter competition proved to be difficult with player numbers. It was rare to field the same team two weeks in a row and on 2 occasions had to play with only 6 players for the entire match. Regardless the team finished on top of the ladder but a disappointing finals match resulted in being beaten by a far better team on the night – this is very difficult to admit as the opposition was our nemesis – DVE. Notes to the Financial Statements

Essendon Water Polo Club Inc. For the year ended 29 February 2016

1. Statement of Significant Accounting Policies

The committee has determined that association is not a reporting entity and accordingly, this financial report is a special purpose report prepared for the sole purpose of distributing a financial report to members and must not be used for any other purpose. The committee have determined that the accounting policies adopted are appropriate to meet the needs of the members.

The financial report has been prepared on an accrual basis and under the historical sost convention, except for certain assets, which, as noted, have been written down to fair value as a result of impairment. Unless otherwise stated, the accounting policies adopted are consistent with those of the prior year.

The accounting policies that have been adopted in the preparation of the statements are as follows:

Property, Plant and Equipment

Property, plant and equipment is initially recorded at the cost of acquisition or fair value less, if applicable, any accumulated depreciation and impairment losses. Plant and equipment that has been contributed at no cost, or for nominal cost, is valued and recognited at the fair value of the assat at the date it is acquired. The plant and equipment is neverwed annually by directors to ensure that the carrying amount is not in excess of the recoverable amount from these essets. The recoverable amount is assessed on the basis of the expected net cash flows that will be received from the utilisation of the assets and the subsequent disposal. The expected net cash flows have been discounted to their present values in estimating recoverable amounts.

Freehold land and buildings are measured at their fair value, based on periodic, but at least triennial, valuations by independent external valuers, less subsequent depreciation for buildings.

Increases in the carrying amount of land and buildings arising on revoluation are predited in equity to a revoluation surplus. Decreases against previous increases of the same asset are charged against fair value reserves in equity. All other decreases are charged to profit or loss.

Any accumulated depreciation at the date of revaluation is offset against the gross carrying amount of the asset and the net amount is restated to the revalued amount of the asset.

Trade and Other Receivables

Trade receivables and other receivables, including distributions receivable, are recognised at the nominal transaction value without taking into account the time value of money. If required a provision for doubtful debt has been created.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held on call with banks, other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less, and bank overdrafts.

Revenue Recognition

Revenue from the sale of goods is recognised upon the delivery of goods to customers.

Revenue from the rendering of services is recognised upon the delivery of the services to sustomers.

- Revenue from commissions is recognised upon delivery of services to customers.
- Revenue from interest is recognised using the effective interest rate method.
- Revenue from dividends is recognised when the entity has a right to receive the dividend.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

Grants

Grant revenue is recognised in the income statement when the entity receives the grant, when it is probable that the entity will receive the economic benefits of the grant and the amount can be reliably measured.

If the grant has conditions attached which must be satisfied before the entity is eligible to receive the grant, the recognition of the revenue will be deferred until those conditions are satisfied.

Where the entity incurs an obligation to deliver economic value back to the grant contributor, the transaction is considered a reciprocal transaction and the revenue is recognised as a lability in the balance sheet until the required service has been completed, otherwise the income is recognised on receipt.

Essendon Water Polo Club Inc. receives non-reciprocal contributions of assets from the government and other parties for a nominal or zero value. These assets are recognised at their fair value on the date of acquisition in the balance sheet, with an equivalent amount of income recognised in the income statement.

Donations and bequests are recognised as revenue when received.

Independent Auditors Report to the members of the Association

We have audited the accompanying financial report, being a special purpose financial report, of Essendon Water Polo Club Inc. (the association), which comprises the committee's report, the assets and kabilities statement as at 29 February 2016, the income and expenditure statement for the year then ended, cash flow statement, notes comprising a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information, and the certification by members of the committee on the annual statements giving a true and fair view of the financial position and performance of the association.
